

- I can't stop myself. This is how carp do things where I come from. I don't know what to do. I do not belong here. I miss my home.


Everybody felt sorry for Chris. He was a good fellow. It was not his fault he was dropped in the lake.

- I can go! volunteered Oliver.


Everybody agreed. Oliver was the bravest fish in the lake and would do the job very well.

- Thank you very much for your help. I will bring Chris here as soon as possible.



Fountain Tree – Spathodea campanulata




Red fire ant – Solenopsis invicta


(2) There are five Carps in the lake below. The scientist needs to find them to send them home. Can you help the scientist to find them?





(4) If you colour all the figures that have a number one and leave the figures with the number two blank you will discover what strange animal Oliver found on his way to the research centre.




(5) These are our friends' scientific names. Can you fit their first name in the crosswords below?
